The beaches of the Ferrolterra Rías Altas region make it possible to choose among the longer beaches facing the open sea with a view of a spectacular landscape, or the quieter inland ria beaches of Ortigueira, Cedeira, Ferrol, and Betanzos. The coastline that runs from the Municipalities of Mañón to Pontedeume boasts a selection of sustainable beaches, in terms of environmental conditions and facilities, which is reflected in the twelve Blue Flag beaches that are found in the Municipalities of Ferrol, Valdoviño, Ortigueira and Mañón.

The Blue Flag is an award and an environmental quality certification system that rewards participation in environmental initiatives of the municipal authorities, the local and visiting population and agents of the tourism sector. The updating of the beaches with Blue Flag status was carried out in 2017; this data that may undergo variations in forthcoming years, given that the distinction is renewed on an annual basis. The beaches distinguished with Blue Flag are shown in the guide with the following symbol:

At the same time, 7 beaches of the Ferrolterra - Rías Altas area are included in the Galician Network of No Smoking Beaches, and belonging to the municipalities of Cabanas, Ferrol, Mañón, Ortigueira and Valdoviño. They appear in the guide with the following symbol:

MAÑÓN

Vilela Beach

43° 45' 12.4" N - 7° 41' 23.2" W **Description:** a sheltered beach, 270 metres in length, with soft sand.

🗖 Bares Beach 🛛 🕒 🔇

43° 46' 17.8" N - 7° 40' 24.4" W

Description: a sheltered and semi-urban beach. Its 1500 metres of soft white sand will entice you to swim in a natural environment, facing the mountain range of Serra da Faladoira and the Estaca de Bares Lighthouse. Its features as a quiet beach and the services it has to offer make it especially suitable for families. Non-smoking beach.

Facilities:

- · Car park and leisure area.
- Showers / Accessible toilets.
- · Accommodation and restaurants nearby.
- · Life guard Service.
- Cleaning service. Selective waste collection.
- Sports court / Children's park.

🗖 Esteiro Beach 🛛 🕒

43° 44' 50.9" N - 7° 43' 22.7" W

Description: a beach in the countryside, with 1850 metres of soft sand and a view of the cliffs. It has sand dunes and it is known for its surf and ocean currents. It is a benchmark in the area for surfing (several surf schools are located there). It is located in the recreational area of Esteiro, which has a pine forest with barbecue facilities, tables, children's playground and sports hall. Non-smoking beach.

ORTIGUEIRA

Picón Beach

43° 44' 38.1" N - 7° 44' 35.3" W

Description: a straight beach set within a rural, isolated, setting, 470 metres in length and with soft white sand. Windy with strong surf and significant risk of undertows. Breath-taking views of the sea and cliffs. Ideal for enjoying the sun, water sports and a natural setting in an uncrowded environment with difficult access. It has stairs to for pedestrian access, showers, parking and picnic area.

O Coitelo Viewpoint

("The best bench in the world")

Description: this spectacular viewpoint claims to have the best bench in the world, from where you can admire the Cliffs of Loiba and the river mouth of the ria with the headlands of Ortegal and Estaca de Bares on either side.

Access: from Ortigueira take the AC-862 in the direction of Viveiro, and drive 11 km until Loiba Parish. Turn left, in the direction of Picón. At the following intersection, drive towards Loureiros-Picón and continue until you arrive at a bus shelter, then turn left and you will be close to the cliff face.

Gabioteira Beach

43° 44' 29.7" N - 7° 45' 17.4" W

Description: Sheltered pebble beach with pedestrian access.



Castro Beach

43° 44' 22.3" N - 7° 45' 33.6" W **Description:** a sheltered beach, 520 metres in length, with soft sand.

Fabrega Beach

43° 44' 18.1" N - 7° 45' 54.9" W

Description: a small beach cove, 500 metres in length, at the end of spectacular cliffs found in the vicinity of Loiba. Almost empty beach with coarse sand and difficult access.

Leisure area of Cadaval

Description: found among a coastal outcrop of the Loiba Parish and has a recreational area on Gaivoteira Beach with tables, benches and information boards about the area.

Access: from Ortigueira, take the AC-862, in the direction of Viveiro, and travel 11 km until arriving at the Loiba Parish. Turn left in the direction of Picón. At the following intersection, take the route to Loureiros - O Picón and then follow the directions to the lookout.

📕 O Carro Beach

43° 44' 17.5" N - 7° 46' 11.3" W **Description:** a sheltered beach, 500 metres in length, with soft sand.

Ribeira Grande - O Sarridal Beach 43° 44' 04.3" N - 7° 46' 31.7" W

Description: 1000 metres of beach and open sea, providing fresh air and at times strong surf. It is found within a breath-taking back- drop at the foot of a high cliff. Pedestrian access only.

Pena Furada Viewpoint

Description: a must-do hiking trail that runs along the local coast, the Pena Furada viewpoint, situated along Sarridal Beach, offers unique panoramic views of the coastline from the Céltigos and Loiba Parishes. Situated upon a coastal outcrop, from where you can admire Pena Furada, a stunning rock formation shaped by the sea facing the beaches of Ribeira Grande (Sarridal). It also offers a spectacular postcard view of the cliffs of Loiba with the zigzagging path leading down to Ribeira do Carro and Os Castros. Access: from Ortigueira, take the AC-862 in the direction of Viveiro and travel 11 km until reaching Loiba Parish. Turn left, in the direction of Picón. At the following intersection, take the route to Loureiros - O Picón and then follow the directions to the Viewpoint.

Arxúa Cove

43° 43' 38.5" N - 7° 47' 43.8" W **Description:** a sheltered beach, 60 metres in length, with soft sand.

Bimbieiro Beach

43° 43' 34.9" N - 7° 47' 41.1" W

Description: a small beach (160 metres), known as the only pebble beach in the area. Its shape varies due to the mouth of the small river flowing into it. Between Eirón Beach and Bimbieiro Beach is a headland, upon which the remains of a Neolithic fortified settlement are found and are now substantially eroded. **Facilities:** easy pedestrian access, hazard signs, showers, cleaning services, toilets.





Espasante

Eirón Beach

43° 43' 23.8" N - 7° 47' 47.5" W

Description: Eirón is a pristine beach, 400 metres in length. It is quite sheltered, has soft golden sand and a low risk of undertows. **Facilities:** rubbish bins.

San Antonio Beach

43° 43' 18.9" N - 7° 48' 16.9" W

Description: a crescent shaped beach within a rural set- ting, 150 metres in length, with soft golden sand. Low winds with moderate surf and ideal for surfing. Close to the town and port of Espasante. Breath-taking views of the sea and cliffs. The woodlands extend down to the beach. Ideal for enjoying the sun, bathing and the natural surroundings. Adjacent to Eirón Beach. Coast path.

Santa Crsitina Cove

43° 43' 22.6" N - 7° 48' 46.0" W

Description: a sheltered beach, 50 metres in length, with soft sand. This beach provides access to Castro Punta dos Prados.

🗖 A Concha Beach 🛛 🖄

43° 43' 15.8" N - 7° 48' 34.0" W

Description: an urban beach, light winds and calm seas, with very low risk of undertows, making it to enjoy swimming and the sun along its 1 km length. An area for leisure boating, with vessels often anchored here. Its features as a quiet beach and the services it San Antonio (Espasante)

has to offer make it especially suitable for families. Non-smoking beach.

A Concha Leisure area

Description: the leisure area can be found alongside the beach with the same name. This means it has amenities such as tables, benches, table tennis, showers, accessible toilets, waste recycling, a car park, playground and exercise park. It is also close to the starting point for the *Ruta dos Mariñeiros* (The Mariners Path), which is part of the Camiño da Costa (The Coastal Path).

🗖 O Ladrido Beach

43° 42' 11.7" N - 7° 49' 45.6" W

Description: a secluded beach with soft sand and calm seas, 50 metres in length. Protected by Isla de San Vicente (St. Vincent's Island), a naturally enclosed spot with a unique ecology found between the mouth of the Ladrido and Santa Marta de Ortigueira Estuaries.

🗖 Morouzos Beach 🛛 🕒

43° 42' 10.1" N - 7° 50' 55.1" W

Description: beach within a 3km rural setting, straight, with soft dark sand and very windy. Moderate surf and some risk of undertows. You can see the beautiful pine forest and extended sand dunes. San Vicente Island faces the beach,

which can be cautiously reached on foot during low tide. Ideal for enjoying the sun, bathing and the natural surroundings. Non-smoking beach. Facilities:

- Car parking.

Pinar de Morouzos leisure area (Morouzos Pine Forest)

Description: Pinar de Morouzos is part of the maritime public domain, consisting of the beach ecosystems, sand dunes and marshlands. In 2005, the whole area became part of a regeneration project that improved amenities and accessibility, with the construction of an accessibility services building, car parking, walkways, table and benches, shelters, information and rest areas, walking trails and bird watching. Due to all of this, Morouzos Beach has for many years received the Blue Flag and Ecopraias Flag. Part of the area is authorised camping space for Ortigueira's International Festival of the Celtic World, one of the most important Celtic festivals in Europe, along with Lorient in France

Access: upon exiting the town of Ortigueira, in the direction of Viveiro, the road to the beach is to the left. Continue along this road for 1.5 km until reaching the beach itself.

CARIÑO

Figueiras Beach

43° 42' 41.8" N - 7° 51' 39.7" W

Description: a small beach, 250 metres long, in a well-maintained environment. Straight with soft white sand. Its calm waters provide the perfect conditions for water sports.

Facilities:

• Cleaning Services.

Fornos Beach

43° 42' 47.8" N - 7° 51' 15.4" W

Description: isolated within a rural setting, a crescent-shaped beach with soft grey with yellow tones sand and close to a pine forest. Windy (ideal for surfing) with moderate surf, apt for swimming and water sports such as water skiing, jet skiing and windsurfing. Located at the entrance to the Ortigueira Ria, making it perfect to take in the amazing natural beauty of the area. Boat anchoring area.

43° 43' 53.9" N - 7° 52' 22.1" W

Description: a sheltered beach, 500 metres in length, with soft sand that enjoys mediumsized crowds during the summer months.

A Concha Beach

43° 44' 18.5" N - 7° 52' 12.3" W

Description: a crescent shaped beach within an urban set- ting, 750 metres in length, with soft white and grey sand. Apt for swimming and water sports. With excellent views of Ortigueira Ria... Docks, with an anchoring area for boats.

O Peiral Cove

43° 44' 39.9" N - 7° 52' 01.8" W

Description: a 40 metre-long beach with dark sands and gravel, within an urban set- ting. Large crowds that are mostly locals. Formed of pebbles and a small part of sand. Windy and moderate surf. Great for snorkelling.

CEDEIRA

Sonreiras Cove

43° 39' 32.7" N - 8° 04' 22.4" W

Description: a small cove (20 metres), with difficult access down long steps and only during low tide. Despite this, the area has a lot of charm and it is shared with an ancient and abandoned shellfish farm

Area Longa Beach

43° 39' 36.1" N - 8° 04' 05.1" W

Description: 220 metres of beach in a semiurban setting, located near Cedeira Port, A crescent-shaped beach with soft white sand. Sheltered from the wind, calm waters, ideal for swimming and water sports (light sailing vessels and rowing). A beach harbour, with anchorage for boats.

A Magdalena Beach

43° 39' 34.7" N - 8° 03' 19.9" W

Description: beach within an urban setting, crescent-shaped beach, 1300 metres in length, with soft white sand. Very sheltered with calm waters, making it apt for swimming and water sports. A beach harbour, with anchorage for boats. A seafront promenade winds its way through the bottom of a pine forest that has tables, benches and a playground ... Pleasant for a stroll, with a children's playground nearby.

VALDOVIÑO

Vilarrube Beach 🗔

43° 38' 17.8" N - 8° 04' 19.5" W

Description: having passed Valdoviño and Pantín, you will arrive at Vilarrube Parish, where there are directions to the beach. 1420 metres of soft white sand and calm waters. The beach is surrounded by mountains and far from built-up areas.

Facilities:

- Car parking.
- Cleaning services
- Showers
- · Life guard Service
- Toilets.

Vilarrube recreational area

Description: much more than a recreational area, it is also a rest area, since it is located between the AC-566 motorway and Vilarrube Beach. It is equipped with four tables and benches, a camping area and surrounded by vegetation. The woodlands are noted for their chestnut trees.

Access: this rest area is reached by following the AC-566 that passes through the township of Valdoviño in the direction of Cedeira. It is located at km 24.

Graxal Cove

43° 39' 16.9" N - 8° 05' 39.2" W

Description: a sheltered pebble beach, 100 meters in length.

Chirlateira Point or Pantín Point

Description: an amazing panoramic view that includes, on one side, Vilarrube Beach and the town of Cedeira with its port, and on the other side, the Concello Coast with Frouxeira Point in the background. From here, you can take in the immensity of the ocean.

Access: from the municipal capital, along the AC-566 motorway towards Cedeira, you will come to a left hand turn-off heading to Baleo Beach. Continue along this road for 2.7 km and you will arrive at a small lookout providing a right-hand side view of the remaining distance to travel. The rest of the way is a path amongst pine trees, which ends at the headlands.

Ouzal Point or Prucallo Point

Description: it is located at 65 metres above sea level. To the right, you can see Chirlateira Point, also called Pantín Point, and to the left Baleo Beach. On a slightly cloudy day, it is possible to even see Frouxeira Point with its distinctive lighthouse, Galicia's latest, and even catch a glimpse of the silhouette of Prior Cape.

Access: from the municipal capital, along the AC-566 motorway towards Cedeira, you will come to a left-hand turn-off heading to Baleo Beach. Continue along this road for 1.7 km and you will see Ouzal Point (Prucallo Point) to the left.

43° 38' 47.3" N - 8° 06' 07.9" W

Description: a crescent-shaped beach within a rural setting, 400 metres in length, with soft white sand. Moderate to strong surf. Ideal for sunbathing and swimming in a natural environment with small crowds.

- Life guard Service.
- Toilets.

Porto Carrizo Beach

43° 38' 34.7" N - 8° 06' 31.4" W **Description:** a sheltered beach, 200 metres in length, with soft sand.

📕 Pantín / O Rodo Beach 🛛 🞑

43° 38' 20.1" N - 8° 06' 33.7" W

Description: this straight beach is in a rural setting, with soft white sands, is very windy and apt for water sports, especially surfing. This place has been chosen for the celebration of the Pantin Classic International Surfing Competition, one of the most prestigious in Europe. 950 metres of beach with a few undercurrents and significant surf.

O Rodo-Marnela leisure area

Description: O Rodo leisure area is found at the entrance to Rodo- Marnela Beach. It has wooden tables and chairs and a children's play area and car park. It is close to Da Rega Lagoon, a reed bed with interesting flora and fauna. **Access:** from the municipal capital, in the

direction of Cedeira along the AC-566 motorway, to the left you will come across a road with a sign indicating the way to Marnela de Riba. Take this road and continue until you get to O Rodo Beach and the recreation area of O Rodo.

Rosella Cove

43° 38' 03.6" N - 8° 07' 39.6" W **Description:** a sheltered pebble beach, 150 metres in length.

Prados Cove

43° 38' 01.6" N - 8° 07' 59.3" W

Description: a crescent-shaped beach within a rural setting, pristine, isolated, 100 metres long, with pebbles and coarse sand. Windy with strong surf. An ideal place to enjoy the quietness of a natural environment with small crowds and watch as the seas come rolling in and break against cliff faces.

O Paraño Lookout

Description: offering a panoramic view of the coast, from Prior Cape (Ferrol) up to the area of Cedeira, specifically A Frouxeira (beach and lagoon).

Access: to get here, take the secondary road from the roundabout at Frouxeira Beach, continue along the coastline for 2 km in the direction of Pantín and Cedeira. The asphalt road leads to the lookout. It has stone benches and a fountain.

🗖 A Frouxeira Beach \, 🕒

43° 36' 53.9" N - 8° 09' 10.3" W

Description: 3500 metres of breath-taking beach, within a semi-urban setting, windy and apt for surfing. Since it is open sea, quite often undertows are created around the end of August, called riptides or *largarteiras*. The beach in enclosed at the headlands where there is a lighthouse and a clear view of the sea and cliffs.

Close by, there set of dunes that can be seen and also the protected area of Frouxeira La- goon.

Frouxeira leisure area

Description: this leisure area is found close to the Frouxeira beach and lagoon. A place enhanced by its beautiful views of the beach and the surrounding natural environment. The meeting of fresh and salt water places a limitation plant diversity of the area. Even so, there are pine trees and other deciduous trees and shrubs (alders, willows).

Due to A Frouxeira Lagoon, it is possible to catch sight of a large number of birds that live in the area, either as permanent residents or just passing through: the Gadwall, blackheaded gull, mallard, Eurasian teal, Eurasian oystercatcher, gray heron, gray plover, Kentish plover, Ringed plover, sanderling and waterfowl, among others. The beach and lagoon at Valdoviño is declared as a RAMSAR area (Wetlands of International Recognition), allowing this leisure area to encroach into a unique and special place. It has tables, benches, a wooden walkway, children's play area and parking.

Access: you can arrive from the municipal capital by taking the road on the left, taking you to A Frouxeira Beach, with the tourist office to your right. After driving 1.5 km, you will come to the beach. The leisure area is to the left as you face the beach.

🗖 O Rego Beach

43° 36' 42.4" N - 8° 11' 30.7" W

Description: an isolated pebble beach set within a rural setting, 160 metres in length. Windy. Nearby is Nuestra Señora do Porto Chapel, which can only be reached during low tide, and Frouxeira Headland Lighthouse. An ideal place to enjoy the quietness of a natural environment with small crowds.

🗖 O Porto Cove

43° 36' 35.7" N - 8° 11' 36.6" W

Description: a pristine, crescent-shaped beach with soft white sand and stones within a rural setting, Windy with moderate surf. Nearby is Nuestra Señora do Porto Chapel, which can only be reached during low tide, and Frouxeira Headland Lighthouse. An ideal place to enjoy the quietness of a natural environment with small crowds. Boat anchoring area.

Frouxeira Lookout

(Meirás Light-house)

Description: Lighthouse and the areas surrounding O Porto Chapel (Meirás) can only be reached during low tide. An amazing area with views of cliffs. It is possible to park close by.

Access: from the municipal capital, along the AC-566 motorway in the direction of Narón, take the right at the first roundabout that you come to after exiting the township. Drive 3 km along the AC-116 motorway and to the right you will come to a crossing that takes you to the Lighthouse and Frouxeira Point.

43° 36' 33.2" N - 8° 11' 33.9" W

Description: a sheltered beach cove with soft sand, 130 metres in length. Non-smoking beach.

🗧 O Cano Grande Cove

43° 36' 31.7" N - 8° 11' 33.0" W **Description:** a small sheltered beach cove with soft sand, 70 metres in length.

🗖 O Río Beach 🛛 🞑

43° 36' 06.0" N - 8° 11' 34.8" W

Description: a beach within a semi-rural setting, 220 metres in length, with soft white sand, ideal for water sports, surfing and windsurfing. Strong surf, open seas and numerous ocean currents. Camping sites nearby. It is located in the parish of Meirás and is accessed from Valdoviño by the C-646 road, following signposted directions to Meirás beach.

Campelo Beach

43° 34' 59.0" N - 8° 12' 56.5" W

Description: within a rural setting, a crescent shaped beach with soft white. Very windy, favourable for surfing. Has car parking. **Facilities:**

- · Life guard Service.
- Showers.
- Toilets.



Santa Comba (Ferrol)

Montefaro o Alto del Campelo Viewpoint

Description: a small point of elevation, just over 250 metres above sea level. From its summit, once occupied by ancient military batteries, there are majestic views of Prior Cape to the west and Frouxeira Point to the east. Down below is Campelo Beach.

Access: you can get to the lookout by driving along the AC-116 motorway, which joins Ferrol with the Municipality of Valdoviño. Upon reaching Meirás Parish, take the road leading to Campelo Beach. For the first section, take the asphalted road and, from the beach car park, follow the asphalted road that heads in the direction of Pico da Vela, Montefaro or Alto do Campelo.

NARÓN

Lopesa Cove

43° 34' 37.6" N - 8° 13' 28.9" W

Description: located in O Val. Within a rural setting, pristine, isolated, and a crescent-shaped beach, 300 metres long. Soft white sand.

Hortiña Cove

43° 34' 18.1" N - 8° 14' 10.4" W

Description: within a rural setting, pristine, isolated, a crescent-shaped beach with white sand. Windy with strong surf. Accessible by car.

Casal Cove

43° 34' 02.3" N - 8° 14' 31.6" W

Description: within a rural setting, pristine, isolated, a crescent shaped beach with white sand. Windy with strong surf. A perfect place to contemplate while admiring the force of the waves, the landscape of the mountain range and the beaches facing Covas and A Frouxeira. Ideal for nature lovers and those that like uncrowded locations.

From the municipal capital, take the Ferrol-Ferrol-Covas motorway, after the parish church take the road to the right in the direction of Ponzos Beach. Take the road to the subdivision until you arrive at the path leading down to the beach.

FERROL

Ponzos Beach

From this point, it was possible to catch sight of the arrival of the whales as they passed through these cold waters during the winter months. Goose barnacles are quite common here. Access: Ferrol-Covas motorway, take the road at Covas to the Prior Cape Lighthouse.

🗖 O Vilar Beach

Description: 250 m in length, with a bicycle and walking path nearby that links the beaches along this part of the coast de Covas. Open beach with soft sand, quiet. This beach has good amenities and a camping place nearby.

Ideal for surfing and body-boarding and the remains of a pre-Roman fort can be seen, where jewellery and Celtic artefacts had been found, and also, along the length of the beach, on the remains of a castle, the installations of a coastal artillery battery was utilized by the Marines. According to the Chronicles, on 25 August 1800, a British flotilla composed of a hundred warships and a large contingent of infantry faced the beach

ready to attempt a landing and take Ferrol. Although apparently straightforward, Admiral Warren's troops had great difficulty with the tidal undertows. The launches became cannon fodder for the soldiers of Ferrol, as the road was well defended and the pass via the lagoon was impractical. Doniños Beach helped contribute to the English defeat.

This is the only beach found within the outskirts of the actual town itself, and is located at the end of the pier, almost under the railroad bridge, equipped with fresh water showers.

Centroña Cove

Description: a 50m straight beach within a semi-urban setting with soft golden sand. Sheltered from winds, offering calm seas and no undertows. Ideal for enjoying the sun, bathing and water sports (swimming, snorkelling, fishing...). Boat anchoring area. Also known as Portiño Beach.

This beach is located in Centroña Parish, about two kilometres from Pontedeume along the coastal road. Forming a series of coves, which during high tide become very confined.

Lago de As Pontes Beach

This beach is 400 metres in length and has cleaning services and lifeguards. It is suitable for water activities. There are two islands on the lake, one for bird watching and another for Galician arboreal flora. As Pontes lake has a walking / cycling route that crosses the perimeter of the lake. On the Memory Footpath, you can discover the natural heritage and the living history of the As Pontes area and its mine.
